Important Information For Parents

Our goal is to look upon all we do, as if, through the eyes of a parent. The individual campers well being is our primary concern. New friends, fun, adventure, and personal growth in a safe and caring environment will offer your child a positive experience that will last a lifetime.

Shortly after registration, parents will receive an information packet to help prepare for camp. Please look this over and feel free to contact our office with any questions or requests. Below are a few items that may be important to you:

- Our medical staff will assist you with any personal or special medical needs.
- All campers take a swim test to insure their safety on the waterfront.
- We strongly encourage non-swimmers to participate in our swim lessons.
- Campers live in cabin or tent sections by age and grade.
- We will honor one housing request per camper so that two friends in the same age group may stay in the same living section.
- Family visitors are welcome at camp but the best time to view the facilities are on arrival and departure days.
- Sibling discounts are available for programs with a minimum one-week stay (excluding Stamper).
- Snacks, souvenirs, some craft supplies, and horse activities have an extra cost. Fees for the Ranch and Circle A Programs include lessons and riding.

Camp Anokijig serves people regardless of race, creed, handicap, or national origin.

Leadership

Our staff are chosen for their understanding of young people and their ability to communicate with them on a positive level. Our camper to staff ratio has been four to one. Most of our staff are previous Anokijig campers, so they bring a perspective to camp work deeply enhanced by Anokijig's rich spirit and tradition. All staff attend an extensive training program prior to camp opening. Kids love us, parents trust us.

Health & Safety

Health and safety are our number one priorities. A medical staff lives at Camp Anokijig. Physicians are available twenty-four hours a day, with a clinic and hospital only minutes away. Our waterfront staff are certified lifeguards. Counselors are trained in First Aid and CPR.

Resident Camp... General Program

Resident Camp is for the camper who wants to do it all! Four different programming schedules are offered.

Day Trip Programs

Day Trips are options within the Resident Camp program. Ranch and Circle A Riders will spend a portion of each day on our working ranch learning horsecare and riding techniques. Together they'll help make something magical happen with characters developed with their imaginations. Competitive Swimming

Resident Camp Specialty Session 4

This program combines all of the activities of Anokijig with an added focus on the sport of competitive swimming. Designed for current (YMCA or U.S.S.) age-group competitive swimmers, activities include approximately two hours per day at a local pool practicing stroke techniques, starts, and turns. Swimmers are videotaped at each pool session and an hour at camp each morning is dedicated to slow motion review of technique and coaching to improve for the next session and beyond.
